Criteria #1 Academic Excellence, Student Success: Score 7 (Meets Expectations)

- Over the past five years the retention rate for the baseball program is above 95%
- Over the past five years the graduation rate for the baseball program is above 90%
- The team GPA for the baseball program has been between 2.6-3.0 every year, and has been 3.0 or above in three of the five years
- Over the past five years the baseball program has had between 5-9 Academic All-Conference players each year, 2 Academic All-Region players, and 2 Summit Award players, 2 SAAC Presidents

Criteria #2 Student Athlete Affordability: Score 1 (Below Expectations)

- Roster size for the baseball program is above the RMAC/NCAA average each year between 60-75 roster players
- The 3.5 equivalencies for the baseball program is far below the RMAC/NCAA average
- The number of student athletes receiving aid is low, and the athletes that receive aid average is \$1000.00

Criteria #3 Institutional Affordability: Score 10 (Significantly Exceeds Expectations)

- Total athletic expenses in relation to pees is low for every player on the roster
- Tuition & fees versus expense is significantly positive for every player on the roster
- The % of tuition given in GF athletic aid is low for every player on the roster

Criteria #4 Community Relations: Score 10 (Significantly Exceed Expectations)

- A high number of regional and valley schools offer baseball as a sport
- Community interest and student-body attendance is high
- Hours of community service in relation to peers is high (Nursing Home Trick or Treat, Penny Harvest, Campus Clean Up, Homecoming parade participant)

Criteria #5 Program Athletic Success: Score 7 (Meets Standards)

- The baseball program has had moderate success in the RMAC
- The baseball program has had winning season in recent past
- The baseball program's success is far above or equal to resources

Criteria #6 Impact: Score 7 (Meets Standards)

- The baseball program is a RMAC required 9 sports total, 10 next year 2019
- Potential Title IX impact if the baseball program is eliminated
- Additional resources would find moderate success in RMAC and would generate moderate community support and interest
