Athletic Program's History and Success

- 3rd coach in 3 years
 - 1st year's roster was inherited from the 2013-2014 coach
 - Coaching changes occurred in the 2014-2015 season
- 2017-2018 is the 1st year in which all participants were recruited by current coaching staff
 - Most winning season in 6 years- 5-16 (Conference: 3-16) *as of 02/11/2018
 - Previous year (2016-2017) 2-22 (Conference: 1-20)

- Compared to other Women's Basketball programs in the RMAC, ASU is in the bottom half comparatively
- ASU competes in the RMAC where there is an average of 4-6 teams ranked nationally every year
- Graduation Rate – 100% of Seniors on the active roster – 2014 – 2017
- Established a New RMAC RECORD for Most 3 point shots made in a RMAC contest – 22 made – VS – Western State – 2/23/15.
